Be it remembered that heretofore 'taunt' at a court of Common Pleas begun and held at the court house in the Town of Bellefontaine in the County of Logan and State of Ohio - on the 27th day of March one thousand eight hundred and twenty six.

In presence of the Honorable Joseph H. Brand Present Judge of our said Court Levi Garwood James M. Piersan and Robert Smith Esq his associates -

The Last will and testament of Peter Kelly Decd was produced in court - and proven by the subscribing Witnesses James Smith and John Shelby - Robert Smith Peter Kelly and Shem Shelby appointed Executors in said will - John Shelby declining to serve and being released by the court

caunt - Robert Smith and Peter Kelly - were duly sworn in open court to discharge the duty of duties devolving on them as executors as aforesaid -

John Smith Brice Blair and Hazeckiah Starbuck were appointed by the court to appraise the property of said Deceased -

In the name of God Amen - I Peter Kelly of the county of Logan and State of Ohio considering the uncertainty of this mortal life and being of sound mind and memory blessed be Almighty God for the same. Do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following (that is to say)

I first I give and bequeath to my Beloved wife Mary Kelly, all the household furniture of every name or description, which I may be possessed of at the time of my Decease (except my book case) Under the head of Household furniture - It is my wish to include my bed and there appendages with every other accoutrement of my house except as above accepted - I furthermore give to her the said Mary Kelly, two cows together with all the sheep, Geese and poultry - I may be possessed of at the time of my Death - These with all the above mentioned he requests to be her own rightful property - and whatever Cattle there may be more than the two cows above mentioned I will and order that they be equally divided among my Daughters then Living

I do also give and bequeath to my son John Kelly the sum of fifty Dollars, to be paid in such trade or property as he the said John Kelly - and my executors can best agree on the same, to be paid within three years after my Decease -

I furthermore give and bequeath to the said John Kelly all my wearing apparel together with my Book case, and do hereby will and order

that my books be equally divided among my sons and Daughters. I do also give and bequeath to the three Children of my Deceased Son Nathaniel Kelly the sum of One hundred dollars, the same to be paid when the youngest comes of age and to be equally divided among them. I do also give and bequeath to my son Peter Kelly, my Wagon and Harness, together with all my farming utensils of every name and nature, to me belonging at the time of my Decease. Also all my horses which may remain, after the herein after mentioned bequests or legacies be paid. I do hereby give and bequeath, to my daughter Sally Haver, a horse beast to be valued at fifty dollars, I do furthermore give to the said Sally and her husband Samuel Haver the one equal third of all the money now due and owing to me in Virginia in trust (that is to say) the use of the same without interest untill Madison Watts and David Watts sons of the said Sally by her first husband arrives at Lawful age at which time I do hereby will and order that in consideration of the above mentioned trust the Sally and Samuel Haver, do pay unto the said Madison and David Watts the sum of money which they the said Sally and Samuel may receive on the above bequest, to be equally divided between them and I hereby bequeath the same to the said Madison and David Watts, in the manner above mentioned. I do also give and bequeath to my Daughter Patty Knox the one equal third of all the money now due and owing to me in the State of Virginia. I do also give and bequeath to my daughter Katy Blog twenty five dollars the same to be paid in such trade or property as she and my executors can best agree on within three years after my Decease. I do also give and bequeath to my Daughter

Peter Enoch the one equal third of all the
 money due and owing to me in the State of
 Virginia also one horse least to be valued
 at fifty dollars - I Furthermore give and
 devise to my son Peter Kelly his heirs and
 assigns all my part of the land which I
 purchased from Joseph Cox - It being
 the part of Section 23 T5 R 13 on which a
 new live Scituate lying and being in the
 County of Logan together with all my other
 free hold Estate whatsoever to hold to him the
 said Peter Kelly his heirs and assigns forever
 And in consideration of the above devise
 I do hereby will and order that my said
 son Peter shall take special care of his
 mother and not let her want for any thing
 which may be necessary to make her life
 comfortable - It is Furthermore my will
 that my said son Peter Kelly shall at all
 times furnish his mother with a good horse
 when it shall be her pleasure to ride during
 the whole time of widowhood - I hereby give
 the one third of my real Estate to my wife
 Mary Kelly during her widowhood, and lastly
 as to all the rest residue and remainder of my
 Personal estate goods and chattels of what kind
 or nature soever - I give and bequeath to my
 said son Peter Kelly, whom I hereby appoint
 one of my Executors with Robert Smith
 and John Shelby, of this my Last will and
 testament, hereby revoking, all other or former
 wills by me made - In Witness whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 27th
 day of November, in the year of our Lord one
 thousand eight hundred and twenty two -
